

Health and COVID Update

***We appreciate the cooperation and understanding from our Fisher families to support our goal of maintaining a healthy school environment. This is a very challenging time of year for parents, teachers...and administrators. We take symptoms seriously, but do not want to be so exclusionary that children and teachers can not attend school consistently and reasonably.

Please be mindful to keep sick children home who can not participate in school. Symptoms at school will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis, with Hema and Yoshie working with teachers to make the best decision. Thank you.***

• Testing: Fisher staff and children will continue <u>every other week</u> COVID testing. Testing will occur during the weeks of: October 31 and November 14.

Message to Fisher Early Learning Center

With fall approaching, the University of Denver, along with the city and state, is moving toward an endemic approach to COVID-19. At Fisher Early Learning Center (Fisher), we administrators welcome this approach with some modifications that recognize the vulnerabilities and ages of our population. We continue to work with our partners at the University and Tender Care Consulting to make thoughtful decisions and establish protocols to promote the health and safety of our students, staff, and their families. We appreciate your patience and cooperation with these efforts.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) on August 11 issued new guidance for K-12 schools and early childhood education programs for addressing COVID-19. We have consulted with the University's public health team regarding the University's plans for implementing this guidance at Fisher.

Fisher will follow the protocols set forth below effective September 1, 2022. Please understand that we may need to adjust these protocols if conditions at Fisher, at the University, or in the surrounding community change or if new variants develop that cause more severe illness and/or greater impact on the Fisher and/or University community.

- 1. Please remember that Fisher is not a place for sick children or adults.
 - For illnesses other than COVID-19, Fisher will follow the Illness policies and procedures set forth in the Fisher Early Learning Center Family Handbook.
 - Students and staff members who are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 must stay home from school and must obtain a laboratory-based PCR test as soon as possible after developing symptoms.
 - Students and staff members who test positive for COVID-19 must follow the
 University's isolation requirements, which include isolating for at least 5 days from the
 date of the positive test, continuing isolation until day 10 or until you receive
 instructions from the University that you are released from isolation, and, as age
 appropriate, wearing a high quality mask (KN95 or N95or, if those are not available, a

surgical mask that is three-ply or better) through day 10.

- 2. Fisher recommends that students follow CDC guidance to stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccinations. Fisher staff members must follow the University's vaccination protocol.
- 3. Fisher will require students and staff to undergo regular scheduled screening testing for COVID- 19 using the schedule below. In light of the new CDC guidelines, we have modified the test-to- stay protocol.
 - Each student must take a laboratory-based PCR test every two weeks in accordance with the schedule set by the Fisher administration. As in the past, DU will conduct this screening testing at Fisher.
 - After classroom exposure, students must test on day 1 and day 5 after exposure and wear a high quality mask, if age appropriate, for 10 days post exposure.
 - After close contact exposure at home: When a family member(s) of a Fisher student tests positive, the student must: (1) as age appropriate, wear a high quality mask (KN95 or N95or, if those are not available, a surgical mask that is three-ply or better) through day 10; (2) submit a negative result from a laboratory-based PCR test before being permitted to return to school (consistent with past practice); (3) obtain a laboratory-based PCR test on the fifth day after exposure; and (4) obtain a laboratory-based PCR test as soon as possible after developing symptoms of COVID-19. If the individual obtains a laboratory-based PCR test from a location other than the University Care Pod, the individual must upload the test result to their myhealth account.
- Student teachers must have a negative result from a PCR test taken the day before their scheduled shift.
- Fisher employees must have a negative PCR test every two weeks.
- Students and staff traveling outside of Colorado, including all international travel, must test upon return home and wear a high quality mask, as age appropriate, until receiving a negative result from a PCR test taken at least 2 days after returning home.
- Fisher students may test at the Care Pod outside the Ritchie Center during the Care Pod's regular testing hours.
- 4. If a student or staff member at Fisher receives a positive result from a COVID-19 test, Fisher administrators will identify other students and/or staff members who have been exposed and are considered close contacts. Those individuals identified as close contacts must:
 - Obtain a laboratory-based PCR test within a day after they are notified of being a close contact (day 1) and on the fifth day after such notification (day 5);
 - Obtain a laboratory-based PCR test as soon as possible after developing symptoms of COVID-19; and

- If age appropriate, wear a high-quality mask (KN95 or N95or, if those are not available, a surgical mask that is three-ply or better) for 10 days from the date on which they were last exposed to the individual who tested positive.
- If the individual obtains a laboratory-based PCR test from a location other than the University Care Pod, the individual must upload the test result to their myhealth account.
- 5. Students and staff members at Fisher are not otherwise required to wear masks, but Fisher is a welcoming environment for those who chose to wear masks as well as those who chose not to wear masks.
- 6. Fisher will continue to emphasize hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette.
- 7. Fisher will encourage classrooms to eat outside during nice weather and as age appropriate.
- 8. Fisher will continue to use air filters and other methods to optimize ventilation in the school.
